The AIOT is pleased to announce that in October 2013 talks have taken place between Celtic Training and AIOT committee members Mr Terry James (President), Mr Greg Gysin (Vice –President) and Mr John Kinealy (Educational Officer).

Celtic Training is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO); they are a national company that has its head office based in Adelaide. Celtic Training is the only RTO that is delivering the Certificate IV in Cast Technology in Australia at this point in time.

The AIOT has just about finalised its modular training program. Celtic training are analysing the modules to see if they will directly map across to the national qualification. If so the program should be ready to roll out sometime in 2014.

An agreement will be drafted between the AIOT and Celtic Training which should see all candidates signed off and examined by AIOT examiners. This is an exciting time for casting in Australia as we are now the only active association in the country, and we will have direct input into the standardisation of the Certificate IV in Cast Technology. We will inform you as soon as the formalities are finalised.


